WOW! It's hard to believe how fast time is flying by. For some of us, it's just another day. For others, going back to school is finally a reality. As many of you are aware, Clark Middle School has adopted Pershing Middle School in Houston, Texas as a result of the devastating damage caused by Hurricane Harvey. When speaking with the principal of the school, he stated that over 100 of his students lost everything and many of his staff members were in the same situation. As a school, we decided to sponsor a "TEN" day. Encouragement was given to the students to bring in denominations of "10." Since this is our tenth year at CMS, our hope was to be able to have students bring in 10 pennies, 1 dime, a dollar, 10 dollars, etc. In the end, we raised almost \$900.00 for the school. Thanks for your help. The Cross Country teams also did a collection at the home meets and raised a total of \$448.25 for the school as well. Again, thank you for your generous help. It's hard to imagine not being able to start school until the end of September, going to school with no school supplies, school being damaged, materials lost, etc. As principal, I am hoping that our act of "service learning" has an impact on our students as it is "better to give than to receive." As we enter the second nine-week period, I want to encourage you to continue checking Skyward and Canvas on a regular basis. Teachers are required to post assignments daily as well as upload the dates of upcoming assessments. If you have questions, feel free to give us a call at CMS.

Our enrollment continues to grow at CMS. Currently we are at 1139 with the 8<sup>th</sup> grade class being our largest at 325, 7<sup>th</sup> grade at 265, 6<sup>th</sup> grade at 285, and 5<sup>th</sup> grade at 264. Over the last several weeks, we have received many new students to our area. I want to express my appreciation to our students and parents, as our students have taken the new arrivals under their wings. It is great to see the number of kids that have stepped up to help out in the lunchroom, classes, etc. Your help is appreciated. Thank you, parents, for instilling the value of "helping/serving" in your children.

## Notes from Mr. Stanisz, Assistant Principal:



2. How do people deal with and explain the impact of damaging events?


## 7th Grade

2. How are people's perceptions shaped?



## 8th Grade



Teachers have been working to get the students not only acclimated to the new year, but working to better their math skills and be ready for testing in the spring. Teachers are using Canvas to post assignments given in class. Please be sure to check each teacher's Canvas page to see what has been assigned in case a child forgets his assignment or will be gone from class. Textbooks for Big Ideas are online. Students can access their books through their Canvas account. Teachers are using I-Ready in class as extra practice to reinforce skills taught in class.

If students need extra help in math class, they can come into tutoring on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Tutoring is open to any student. As a reminder, tutoring begins at 8:00 a.m. It is important the students bring questions or work that needs to be reviewed when coming to tutoring. They will be presenting interesting lab experiments that the students can participate in.




Applications for new members will be given to students who have qualified to be a part of the National Junior Honor Society early second semester. Students in the 7th and 8th grade who have a cumulative grade point average of a 3.33 will be receiving applications. In order to become a member of the Clark chapter of the National Junior Honor Society, members must complete the application and then be selected by a faculty committee. Just getting the application does not guarantee membership. **Students must have at least two in-school and two out-of-school activities** and answer an essay. The following are examples of activities: Jazz Band, Swing Choir, ISSMA, Chess Club, Friendship Club, Science Olympiad, Academic Superbowl, Dance, Cheer, Sports, Winter Guard, Theatre, Church Youth Group, Religious Classes, Club Sports, etc. You must be in an activity for at least one semester or a full athletic season for an activity to count. The following activities **DO NOT count**: any classes (band, peer mentoring, etc.), babysitting, pet sitting, bake sales or other one-day fundraisers, races/color runs etc. Any questions about what is considered an in-school activity can be answered by checking the agenda book for school activities or contacting Mrs. Giannini at Clark.

Anytime you volunteer, you **MUST** have a current limited criminal history check on file and a copy of your drivers license. There is **NO** cost.

## Clark Middle School After-School Procedures



To improve the safety of our students, staff, and guests, please follow the procedures listed for car riders. All students who are being picked up will need to exit the building at Door J, which is the main entrance. We will load and release cars along the curb first. We strongly encourage everyone picking up to get in this line. We usually have cars loaded and released by 3:50. Students waiting to enter the parking lot to a guest in a parked car will be released after the cars along the curb have exited. Please do not use the other lanes in the parking lot to pick up or drop off your children. Those lanes are for cars to find parking spots. In addition, please do not use the parking spots designated for our handicapped guests unless you have the appropriate pass.

Thanks for working with us to make our parking lot safer for all. Please share this information with anyone that will be picking up your children.

### **OPTION 2: Check**

You can send a check with your student or bring it in personally to your student's school. On the check please mark clearly your student's first and last name, their ID #, and your driver's license number. Turn in deposits in the Food Service deposit box located in the school office or to the cafeteria cashier(s).

### **OPTION 3: Cash**

We ask you refrain from sending cash, but you can send money in with your student or bring it in personally to your student's school in an envelope clearly marked with your student's name, their ID #, their teacher's name, and \$ amount. Turn in deposits in the Food Service deposit box located in the school office or to the cafeteria cashier(s).


