Happy Second Semester.....I hope everyone had a great holiday season!

As we prepare for the upcoming semester, I encourage you to continue to keep communication lines open with your child's teachers in regard to any academic concern. Our approach at CMS is that all staff members are expected to respond to your concerns within a 24-hour period. If you feel that you need to have a meeting with the teacher to discuss a concern, please let us know.

Second semester is busy with 8th grade scheduling, upcoming ISTEP tests, as well as student selection in grades 5-7 for their specials (full year for band-choir OR the rotation.) Please make sure to check the school website daily for announcements regarding the events and deadlines.

The winter season can be a bit dicey, so please consider the following situations:

If a two-hour delay takes place, what will my child do? Do I have an alternate plan? Where will they go until school starts, AND what if the delay turns into a cancellation? Do I have a plan?

If an early dismissal occurs, what are my plans?

Is my child dressed appropriately for the weather (warm jacket, boots, etc.)?

Does my child have access to the house in case of an early release?

Please plan on having an emergency plan, just in case.

With the ending of the holiday season, many students have received a new piece of technology called a "cell phone." While cell phones are a good thing, we seem to deal with a lot of unfortunate issues with the devices. We ask all parents to refrain from sending cell phones to school; however, if a child brings one to school, it must remain in the locker area or in the back pack. If there is an emergency situation, the administration will be contacting you via the Alert Now system. Also, students should not be using their cell phones to text you, asking you to bring them lunch, or pick them up because they don't feel good. If your child is not feeling good, then they need to stop by and see the nurse who will then contact you. We have many situations where a parent shows up to school and states that my child texted me and told me to pick him/her up due to illness. Please remind your child to follow proper procedures. We appreciate your help in this area.

The enrollment at CMS continues to grow daily. Over the holiday break, we enrolled five new students. It's great to see the new students at CMS and we look forward to working with them at Clark. Thanks to the CMS students for assisting and making the new students feel welcome. It's great to see the students finding someone to sit with at lunch on day one. Coming to a new school can be very difficult for children, and I appreciate the help that our CMS students provide to make them feel welcome.

Thanks to YOU, as parents and guardians, for supporting CMS in so many ways prior to the holidays. We were able to provide over 200 pairs of hats, mittens and gloves, along with barrels of slightly used and new shoes to Sojourner Truth House in Gary. 8th Grade Scheduling for Freshman Year:

Incoming freshman at Lake Central have the opportunity to take PE, pool, or both during the summer. A lottery will be held to determine placement in the classes. Parents may register their student for the lottery through a Google form link that is available on the LCHS main website from Monday, January 22nd, starting at 7:30 a.m. to Wednesday, January 31st, ending at 3:00 p.m. The link is under NEWS (which is below the Quick Links). The lottery will be held on February 1st. Parents will be notified via email by February 7th if their student is selected.

Counselors at Clark will meet with all of the 8th graders during the school day on Monday, January 22nd and Tuesday, January 23rd to review important scheduling information for high school. The meetings will take place during their Social Studies class and students will receive information on SKYWARD scheduling, which will open for parents and students on MONDAY, January 29th. The students will be given paperwork to bring home for your review along with information on their course selections.


Author, Gordon Korman visited Clark Middle School Friday, November 17, 2017


YHBA READING CONTEST


LCEF GRANTS

The CMS library received funding from the LCEF Grant Round 46. Funds are to purchase books written by author Gordon Korman for the library collection.



Now, in the week of January 22nd, we will be deciding grade-level and school-wide champions. The Clark champion will take an online test in order to qualify for the state championship at IUPUI in Indianapolis in March.



Second semester is quite busy for the students and teachers in the math department. With the upcoming ISTEP tests approaching, we have been preparing the students for the upcoming tests. Teachers are still continuing to do I-Ready in classrooms, which can also be done at home if parents are looking for something extra to be done. Please remember that tutoring is offered to any student on Tuesday and Thursday mornings at 8:00. We ask that students come prepared and ready to go over whatever is needed. Finally, if any parent has any questions or concerns about your child's progress, please contact your student's teacher.



The 6th grade Science classes will be attending the Challenger Learning Center during the first week of February. The students will be participating in the MISSION TO MARS. They will be taking the material they learned in class and apply it to several jobs that will be performed during their time at Purdue.

The 7th grade classes have been studying The Water Cycle. Some of the students were able to construct an aquifer from common household products. They will also be researching weather systems. The ADV classes will be researching a topic in WEATHER and presenting their information to their peers during class.

8th grade classes have been reviewing the CELL and creating a CELL CITY as their project for 3rd quarter.

The creativity that the students have shown this year has been incredible. These projects will be displayed in their science classrooms throughout the quarter.



- How can lack of communication interfere with the relationship between you and your parents?






8th Grade Dance Parent Meeting



- Parents will be notified of results via provided email by February 7.
- If chosen in the lottery, PAYMENT MUST BE MADE by Friday, February 23.
- Information regarding a wait list and how to make payment will be included in the February 7th email.
- Complete the form only once. If you have more than one student to register, you will make note of that in the survey. Siblings are then "drawn" together so they get the same session or sessions.
- Completion of the lottery form is not a guarantee of enrollment in the courses requested. It serves only as registration in the lottery.

- Session 2 June 25 to July 12 from 8am - 11:38am

Due to the condensed length of these classes, students must be in attendance and participate for the entire session to earn credit.
