Welcome to Clark Middle School—Home of the Coyotes! As we begin the 2018-2019 school year, I extend a special welcome to our incoming 5th grade students as well as any new student that is coming to CMS. WELCOME! The CMS staff anticipates a great year and looks forward to several years of outstanding instruction by our teachers.

Communication continues to be a vital part of the success at CMS. I encourage you, as parents, to stay engaged with your child. Please ask questions if you are not sure about our policies or procedures. In regard to the educational process, if you have a question about what is taking place in the classroom or a grade issue; please contact the teacher first before contacting the guidance or administration. It is my expectation that a response to your email or voice mail occurs within 24 hours. If this does not happen, please contact me.

One aspect of communication that I use is the Alert Now message system. While some administrators might opt to send a Friday message, I tend to ONLY send out messages when I feel it is warranted. Our announcements are posted daily on the website; therefore, I want the Alert Now Message to be of importance when you hear the broadcast.

As soon as you register your child (July 26-August 9 (10:00-6:00) and walk the building, find

hang anything in the locker area—please use magnets and not tape. Spirit wear and physical education uniforms will be available for purchase as well. Please do not try and come to school prior to the August 9th date to put things in lockers, etc., as there are staff meetings and other things taking place in the building, PLUS the custodial staff will be doing their final push to have everything cleaned and ready for the start of school. I appreciate your help in this matter. If you are on vacation and cannot make the August 9 date, your child will be able to go to their locker on the first day of school after the 8:37 bell rings. As the year begins, I ask that you assist us with the items listed below. It is critical that we work together for the benefit of the students and staff daily. Please follow the established guidelines regarding drop off and pick-up procedures, volunteering, assisting in a classroom, medications, homework, and dress code issues. Clark is a very busy place. With this in mind, please help your child by doing the following items regularly:

Check the CMS website frequently as updates, changes, and announcements are listed daily

Breakfast is served in the cafeteria beginning at 8:15—bus riders' need to tell the bus drivers that they need to be released so that they can get breakfast if they choose. A bus pass will be given to the students by the administration if an early release is requested.

If you are planning on picking your child up early, please send a note to the main office indicating the time that you need to pick up your child and they will be waiting on you in the main office area. You must come in and sign your child out of school.

Please DO NOT park in the handicapped parking spaces unless you are handicapped or have permission to park in the reserved spots—we have several parents that need these reserved spots to assist getting their child into school.

Check the corporation calendar regularly. Please note that the calendar is online. We do not have calendars available for you in the main office. Please note days that we are not in session to assist with vacation planning.

Monitor what your child is wearing to school—dress code rules apply.

If you are volunteering at school, please make sure that you have completed a limited criminal history check form—the forms is valid for 1 year and is available in the main office area. A copy of your driver's license is required.

Please support the school fundraisers. Many of our programs, assemblies, and positive reinforcement programs take place because of your effort and support. I appreciate and THANK YOU in advance.

Clark has many activities and programs for the students to take part in from academic clubs and competitions to athletics and drama. Please encourage your child to get involved and continue those activities throughout the middle school years. If your child is hoping to make NJHS, they need to have 2 in-school and 2 out-of-school activities in order to be considered. For more information on what is available at CMS, please check out your child's agenda book and scroll through the announcements on the website for meeting dates and times.

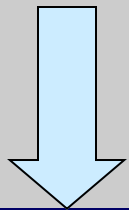

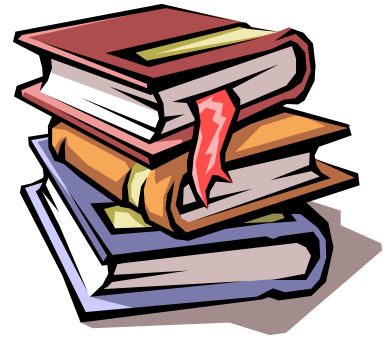

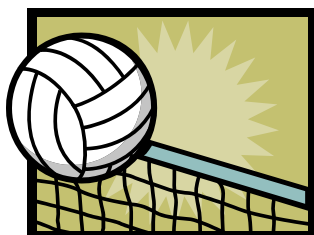
CROSS COUNTRY RUNNERS AND PARENTS

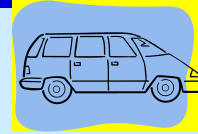

Clark Middle School After School Procedures



To improve the safety of our students, staff, and guests, please follow the procedures listed for car riders. 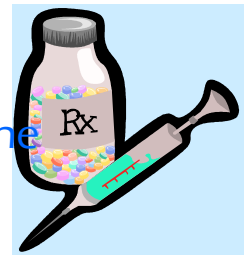
FROM THE NURSE

The nurse will be in the office on August 13th from 12:00 - 2:30 p.m. for those parents who need to bring in medication, diabetic supplies, or discuss any health issues.

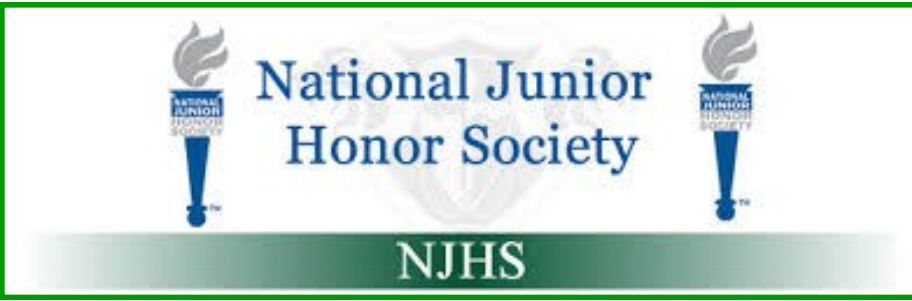
Medications

All medications administered at school must have a signed "[Medication Form](#)" on file in the nurse's office. Prescription medicine by physician and/or over-the-counter medicine by a parent must be in the original container with the child's name on the bottle or package. In addition to the required form, herbal supplements are considered medications and need written instructions signed by a physician prior to administration. The medication form can be picked up in the main office or you can go to the Clark website and print it online.

The medication can be brought as early as August 12 or on the first student day.



All 6th graders need a second varicella (chicken pox), meningitis, and Tdap vaccine before they start the 2018-2019 school year. The immunizations can be turned into the nurse's office as early as August 12 or on the first student day.



Applications for new members will be given to students who have qualified to be a part of the National Junior Honor Society early second semester. Students in the 7th and 8th grade who have a cumulative grade point average of a 3.33 will be receiving applications. In order to become a member of the Clark chapter of the National Junior Honor Society, members must complete the application and then be selected by a faculty committee. Just getting the application does not guarantee membership. **Students must have at least two in-school and two out-of-school activities** and answer an essay. The following are examples of activities: Jazz Band, Swing Choir, ISSMA, Chess Club, Friendship Club, Science Olympiad, Academic Superbowl, Dance, Cheer, Sports, Winter Guard, Theatre, Church Youth Group, Religious Classes, Club Sports, etc. You must be in an activity for at least one semester or a full athletic season for an activity to count. The following activities **DO NOT count**: any classes (band, peer mentoring, etc.), babysitting, pet sitting, bake sales or other one-day fundraisers, races/color runs etc. Any questions about what is considered an in-school activity can be answered by checking the agenda book for school activities or contacting Mrs. Giannini at Clark.
