Happy New Year and Happy 2020! I hope you had a wonderful holiday with friends and family. As we begin a new decade, I am excited to see what this semester will bring for us at CMS. We have a great group of students, supportive parents and a wonderful staff who are ready and willing to become part of your team. Please partner with us this year as we strive for success. All students have different ability levels so let's work together and challenge your child(ren) so that they can get the best education.

Communication between all stakeholders continues to be one of the most important facets in the success of the child. Please let the staff, guidance counselors or administration know your child is having some concerns at home, school, etc. Teamwork is critical as we work to come up with the best possible plan for your child. At this age, parents should be seeing students bring homework home almost nightly, except for Friday (however, some may have work on Friday or over the weekend). Please take time nightly and go over CANVAS with your child. Check and see what assignments have been given or when the next test is so that you can "chunk" your study time and not have to "cram" for the exam.

Parents....with the changes in weather, please make sure to check and see what your child is wearing to school. During the colder parts of October, we had students that were wearing shorts and short sleeved shirts to school. If we would happen to have an emergency situation and the students would need to be outside for a period of time, it is critical that all students have a jacket at school. Jeans are not allowed to have holes above the knees and all students must wear shirts that have their shoulders covered. Please help us by helping your child with appropriate clothing.

Cell phones seemed to be a big holiday gift item. As a reminder, cell phones are not allowed out during the day at school. They must be kept in the locker and turned off. Students have been warned that if cell phones are observed, they may be collected and parents might be asked to come and pick them up at the end of the day. We do not need students' texting their parents if they are sick, etc. as we have procedures in place for this to happen, i.e., school nurse. If there was an emergency situation, you would be notified by one of the administrator via the school Alert Now messaging system. Students with ear buds and/or air pods need to keep them in the locker.

For 8th grade parents, your child received their PSAT scores on January 10th in a meeting that I conducted with them in the LGI room. Information was provided to them about how the PSAT works, what the scores mean, and how they can receive more information in regard to their complete document. I reminded ALL students that this semester is critical as we begin to do high school scheduling with the CMS counselors. Students need to be putting forth their best effort in all classes.

On January 29, CMS will be hosting a STRAIGHT "A" breakfast for students in the cafeteria. Current numbers indicate that almost 220 students will be invited and celebrated. GREAT job by all of the students who maintained STRAIGHT "A's". We are proud of you and your efforts. Keep it up!

In late March and early April, all students will begin the practice component for the upcoming ILEARN state test. The state requires that all students take a practice test in all of the subtests for the ILEARN test. Therefore, 5th grade will take practice tests in ELA, math, and SS. 6th grade will take practice tests in ELA, math, and science. 7/8 grade students will ONLY take practice tests in ELA and math. The actual test is scheduled for April 20-May 15. If at all possible, please make sure to have your child present at the start of the school day. We will be operating on a couple different schedules (which will be posted on the school website). If you must schedule a doctor or other appointment, please try and do so after 12:00pm. Your help would be greatly appreciated as students cannot go on to the next test until all parts of the prior test are completed. This year, the state has recommended that schools not test for more than 1 hour per day, so we need your child in attendance daily.

Criminal history background checks...if you want to volunteer at CMS, please make sure that you have a background check completed. With the new system, it may take approximately 3 weeks to get your background check completed and returned to us. If we do not have a background check and you show up to volunteer, we will not be allowed to have you volunteer. 5th grade parents...plan ahead for field day, etc.

Parents...if interested, I am looking for some help for our end of year cook-out/fun time in the sun day. Our cook-out is planned for May 15. Our goal is to have all students eat outside and enjoy a wonderful grilled hamburger or hot dog, etc. Last year we had several sport stations set up so the kids could enjoy some fun time after they ate their lunch. If you are interested, please make sure that you have a completed background check on file and send me an email (sgraber@lcscmail.com) and I will put you on the list. I would like to take this time to introduce myself to all of you. My name is Nick Stamate and I am your School Resource Officer here at Clark Middle School. I have been a Police Officer in St. John for 19 years.

I am a 1st class patrolman and have certifications in several areas. First and foremost, I graduated from the School Resource Officer School in October 2019. Also I am a Close Quarter Combat and Defensive Tactics instructor. I am a certified crime scene evidence technician as well as a certified field training Officer. I have worked with the schools my entire career as a Police Officer working special events and other activities. In the early 2000's, I was the night operations supervisor for Lake Central High School.

I have always enjoyed working with the schools and students and am honored to represent Clark Middle School as your School Resource Officer. My **TOP PRIORITY** is student safety here at Clark. There are 5 School Resource Officers in the Lake Central School Corporation. We work together constantly to find ways to enhance and promote student safety. In the near future, your child will participate in several programs including vape awareness, drug awareness, walking and bicycle safety and the dangers of social media.

Throughout my day here at Clark I spend time with the students during lunch and in the hallways during passing period. My goal is to build a positive atmosphere here at Clark and to mentor the students into making positive choices that will affect their future. We also do fun things from time to time like the donut challenge and rewarding good behavior and good deeds. I have an open door policy here at Clark and welcome any of you to contact me if you have any questions or concerns.





The 2^{nd} semester has started and the guidance department has been busy preparing for several events. All 8^{th} graders will meet with the counselors during their social studies classes on February 4^{th} to discuss all the information pertaining to scheduling for 9^{th} grade at Lake Central High School. The counselors will talk to them about the various diploma types and appropriate courses they can elect to take, along with all the freshman required classes. The students will schedule on Skyward February $18^{th} - 25^{th}$. The counselors will assist students in the computer lab here at Clark on Feb. 18^{th} and 19^{th} . Parents should also login with their student at home that week to review course selections. All of the required classes will be preloaded into Skyward.

Parents can opt to sign their student up for the SUMMER POOL and PE classes that are offered at LC, and selection for the classes will take place through a lottery system. A Google form link is available on the LCHS website beginning Wednesday January 22nd at 7:30 a.m. through Friday, Jan. 31st at 2:30 p.m. Parents will be notified by email Monday February 10th if their child was selected for summer Pool or PE. This information is also posted on the LC and Clark website.

The **Straight "A" Breakfast** will be held during 1st period on January 29th. All students making A's for the first semester will be invited. We look forward to celebrating this accomplishment with the students!

The 8th graders in digital communications classes have had the opportunity to do career exploration via interest inventories in NAVIANCE. This information is very useful for the students as they move into high school and formulate plans for their graduation pathway and future goals. Students in digital communications 2nd semester will complete the NAVIANCE inventories by the end of January.

In November the counselors presented an informational session on **Child Abuse** to all grades. Students will continue to participate in Bullying seminars during Health/PE second semester, which is also facilitated by the counseling department.

- ☐ How we can all help



Any parent of next year's 7th or 8th graders, please be mindful of the following. Applications for potential new members will be given to students who have qualified to be a part of the National Junior Honor Society early second semester. While that is a long way off, there are a few items to keep in mind to ensure your student meets the requirements for membership. Students in the 7th and 8th grade must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.33 to receive an application. In order to become a member of the Clark Chapter of the National Junior Honor Society, members must complete the application and be selected by a faculty committee. Just getting and/or completing the application does not guarantee membership. Students must have at least two inschool and two out-of-school activities (these must be from 6th, 7th, or 8th grade) and write a one-page essay. For out-of-school activities, students need to have some sort of documentation to prove they were members. If signatures/proof of membership is not provided, it will NOT count as an activity. So for any summer programs, sports, activities, etc., please keep receipts, rosters, a letter from the sponsor/coach, etc. These might be hard to track down next spring if they happened in the summer, so keep it in mind now! In the fall, when call-out meetings are going on, please encourage your student to get involved! Membership cannot happen at the time of application and count towards their activities. Students must be in an activity for at least one semester or a full athletic season for the activity to count. Also, if a student plans to participate in track or other spring activity, they cannot count that as one of their activities since the season has not happened at the time of application.

In-school activities are those sponsored by Clark Middle School and/or Lake Central School Corporation. The following are examples of activities that count for membership in-school: Jazz Band, Swing Choir, **SOLO** ISSMA (not the group required for class), Chess Club, Friendship Club, Science Olympiad, Academic Superbowl, dance, cheer, sport teams, etc. The following activities **DO NOT** count: any classes (band, peer mentoring, office aid, etc.), babysitting, pet sitting, bake sales or other one-day fundraisers, races/color runs or other one-day events. **Any questions about activities can be directed to Mrs. Giannini at mgiannin@lcscmail.com**.









Clark Math Counts students will be participating in the annual Calumet Regional Competition on February 5, 2020 at Valparaiso University.
