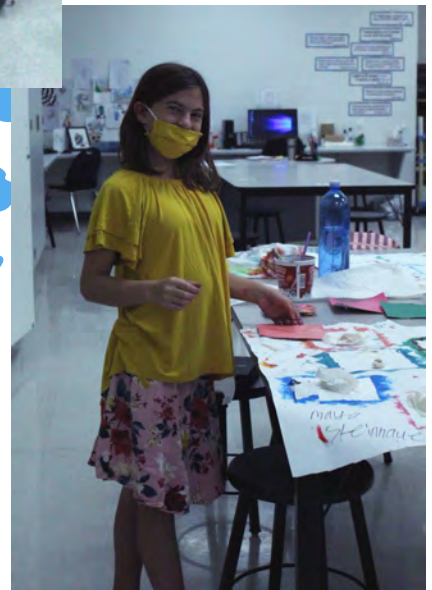
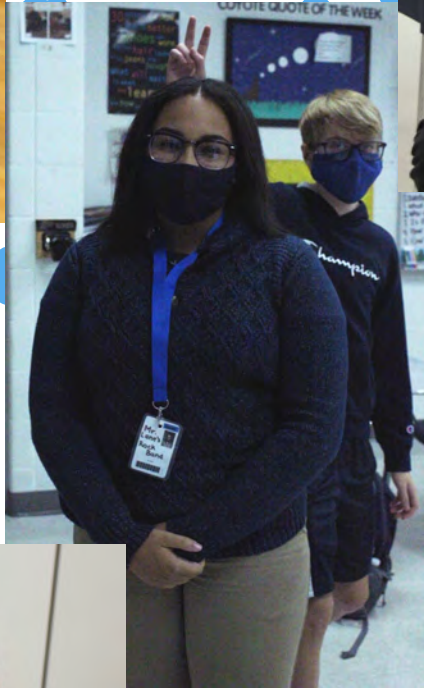
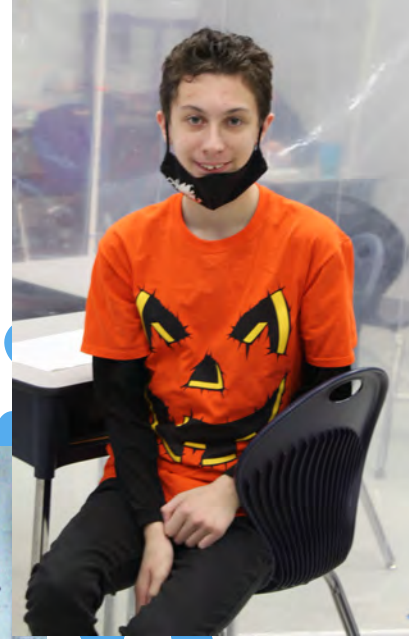

HALLOWEEN

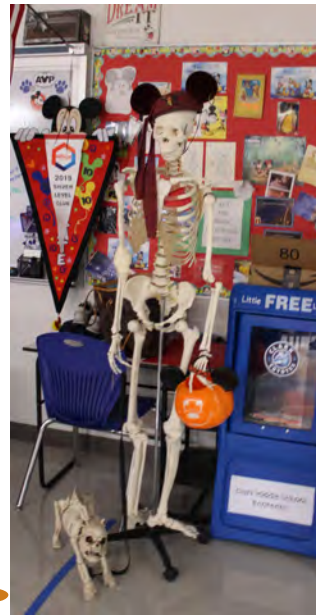

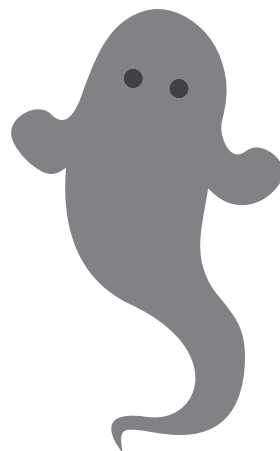


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With Halloween on Saturday, teachers didn't see their students. Some still decorated their doors in anticipation of the holiday.
