

For the 2022-23 school year we are changing from FamilyID to [Final Forms](#). You can find the link to register on the Clark Athletics website. After a parent/guardian registers, students need to log into Final Forms (using their school email) and complete part of the registration. [IHSAA physical forms](#) can be turned into Mrs. Smith or uploaded into the "files" in Final Forms prior to tryouts/season starting. Reminder that all physicals for the 2022-2023 school year need to be dated 4/1/2022 or after. If you are having a hard time scheduling a physical exam with your child's physician, you can go to any Midwest Express Clinic or CVS Minute Clinic for a physical exam. Please make sure to take proper forms with you. We are hoping to have a Middle School Physical Night in the beginning of August also.




