

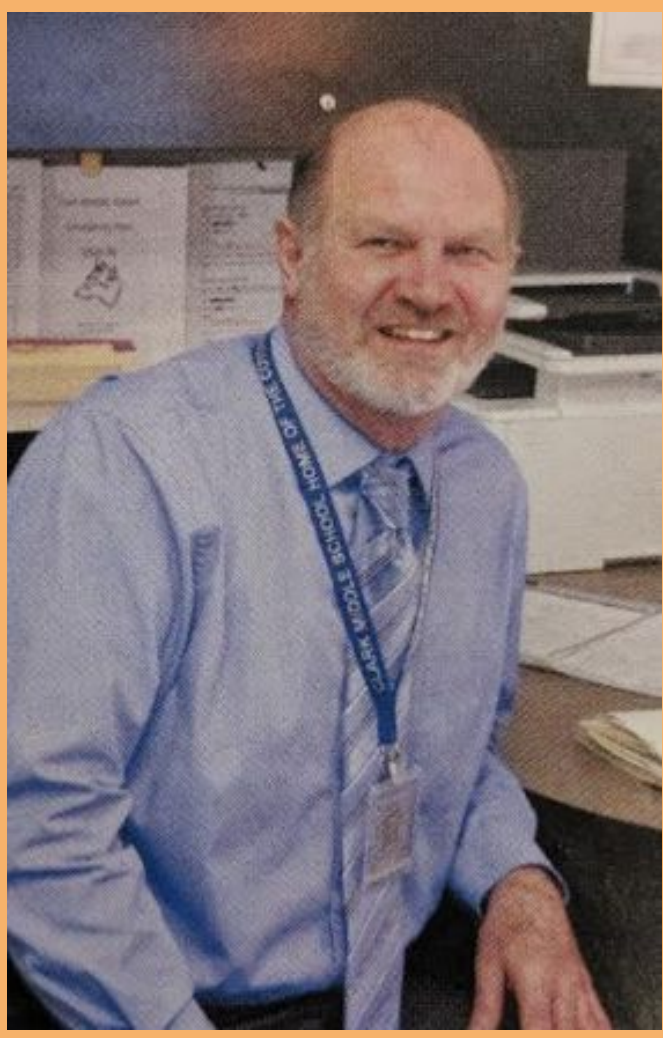

Wow! It's hard to believe that we have been in school for almost three weeks. The students and staff have been doing an amazing job with some of the changes that we implemented, so "Thank You" as parents, for assisting and helping out. I am excited about this school year and looking forward to some amazing things from your children and our staff members.

During the week of August 21, the administrative team met with all of the students and went over expectations for this year. Some of the changes we discussed were having water bottles, cell phones, air pods, and back packs to remain in the locker areas. For those students that need to have a cell phone or water bottle with them due to medical reasons, please make sure that we have proper documentation from your child's doctor in regard to any medical needs.

Communication is critical to our success at CMS. So, if as a parent, you have a concern or issue, please reach out to your child's teacher first (if classroom related), and then feel free to follow up with your child's counselor or one of the administrators. As a reminder: Mrs. Churilla, counselor, last names "A- Har"; Ms. Vail, counselor, last names "Has-Pio"; and Mr. Biscan, last names "Pio-Z." When dropping off in the car rider line, we try very hard to release at least 4-5 cars at a time. Please help us by having your child ready to be released from the car upon arrival. If you are picking your child up in the parking lot, we ask that all students, parents and staff members use the walkway that is identified. If driving in the lot, please be careful and observant of students and other parents.

Our school theme this year is "Have a Marvel-ous School Year!" Check out the announcements daily for information pertaining to activities for the year, club-group meetings, etc. Let's have some fun this year.

ILEARN scores were distributed to the students on the first day of school. Hopefully, you received my Alert Now message indicating a need to check for them from your child.

For those of you that are new to middle school, WELCOME! Please note that I do not send a Friday message via the Alert Now system but rather when there is something important that needs to be shared with you. If there is an emergency situation at CMS, you will receive an Alert Now message from one of the administrative staff. In addition, please check the CMS website for daily announcements, spirit wear sales, and any club or group meeting dates. Clubs and groups will begin meeting in early September so stay tuned.

Welcome back to the 2023-2024 school year! I hope everyone had a wonderful summer! It has been great to see everyone back at school! I wanted to take this opportunity to talk about some programs we have available at Clark to help students who may be struggling with their classes. First, we do offer free tutoring on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Tutoring will start after Labor Day. Students are free to use this time from 8:00-8:30 to get extra help from teachers in areas where they may struggle or need extra help.

While tutoring is not exclusively 1 on 1, it does provide an opportunity for students to work on skills, oftentimes with students who have the same questions. The only thing we ask is that students come prepared with questions or specific areas where they may need help. This will help teachers narrow their focus.

Secondly, we do offer a program called RTI. RTI is another way to support students who may struggle in math or reading. For example, some students struggle with reading comprehension. Mrs. Losito, our reading specialist, works with students in small groups 1-2 times per week to enhance reading skills. For math, we do offer a math lab class for grades 6-8. Math lab provides a smaller setting to work on supplemental math skills.

Finally, during Advisory from 8:47-9:12, we offer academic assistance. This is like tutoring, only during the school day. Students can get a pass from their teacher to go another teacher's room to work on areas they may need help in.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me so we can help your student.

We encourage everyone to use the car rider line for student safety. Also, parents cannot stop in the middle of the crosswalk area and must allow traffic and pedestrians to keep flowing. Parents must STOP at all of the crosswalks here at Clark Middle School to yield to pedestrians. I provided the students with safety information for walkers, bicycle riders, bus and car riders. We also encourage them not to have their earbuds or headphones on during arrival and drop off for their safety. So far things are going great!! New Student Breakfast

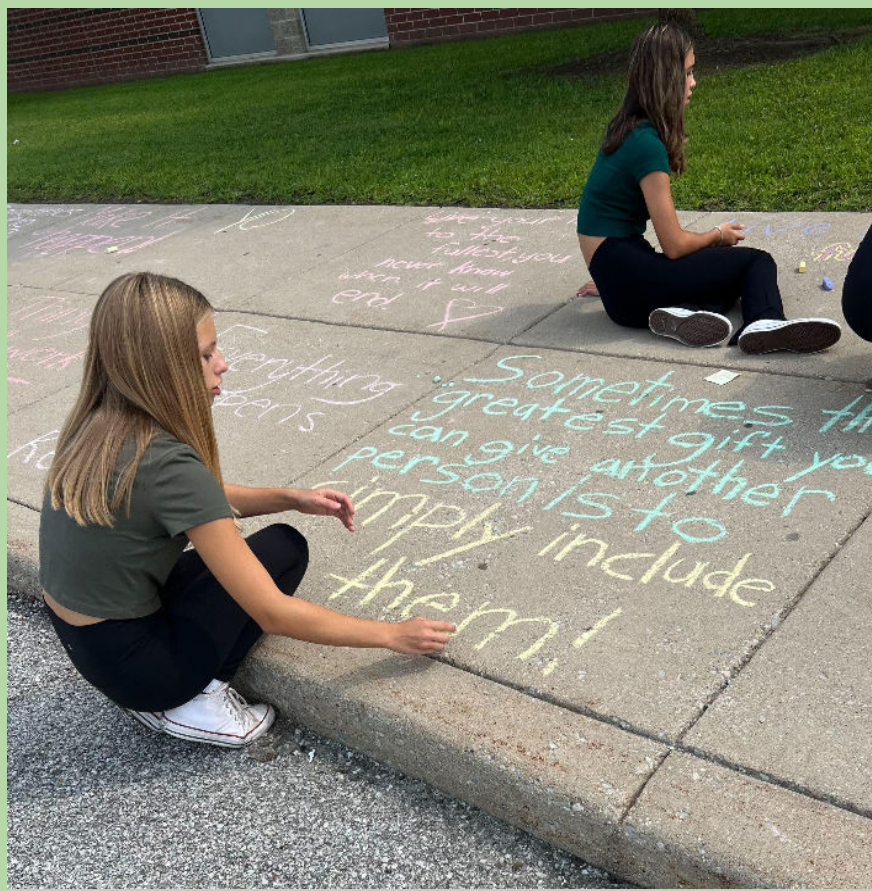

The Power of Words and Sidewalk Chalk

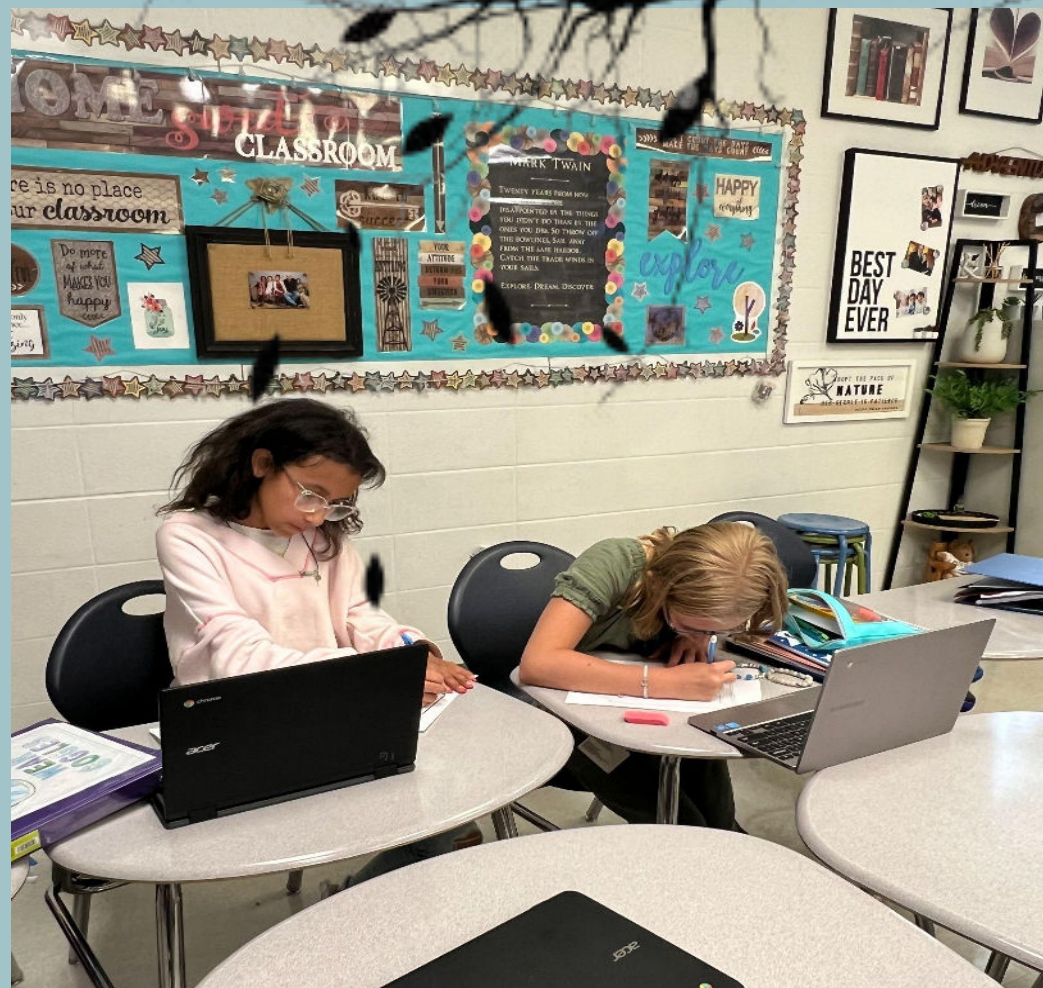
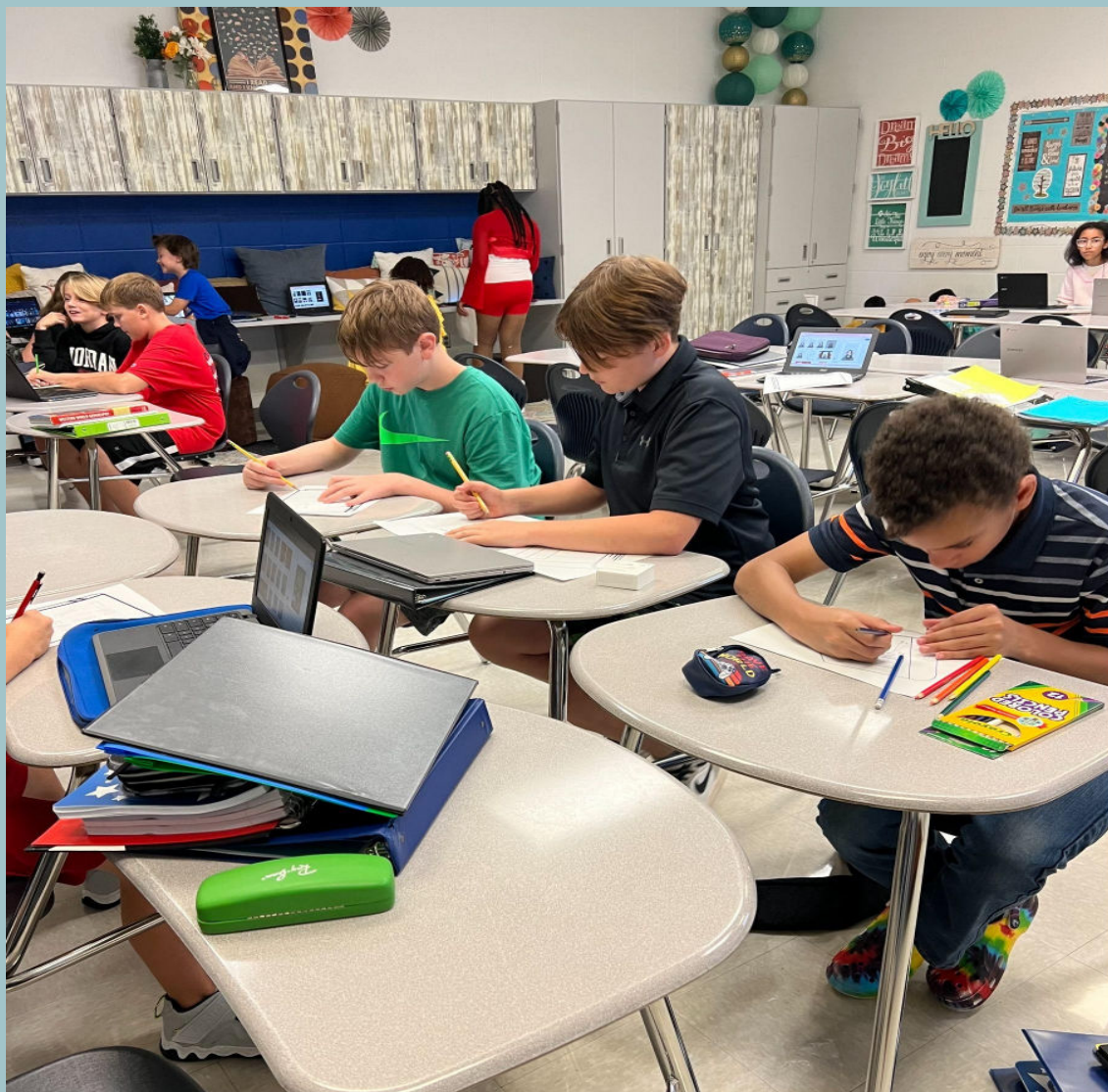
Mrs. Castle's eighth graders examine the power of words through various quotes.

She competes against men and women alike, all ages, adult amateurs and even professionals in some open classes. Show jumping is one of the equestrian events still held in the Olympics. Prior to focusing solely on show jumping, Brie competed for a national title when she was 9 years old in a hunt seat division. Brie has been riding horses since she was about 6 years old. She now has her own horse, a grey mare, named Kinetic. Kinetic is a six year old Hanoverian and Brie calls her Kinley. Brie rides five to six days a week all year long. Rain, snow, or shine, her horse needs exercise! She usually takes lessons three times a week with her Hunter/jumper trainer Gianna Gierczyk and her dressage trainer, a silver-medalist, named Diane Boeninger. She competes on the show team for West Gate Equestrian out of Beecher, IL and owned by Gianna Gierczyk. Brianna's goal is to ride Division 1 in college for Stanford and study business and finance. Lake Central Parent Instructions for Student Logins

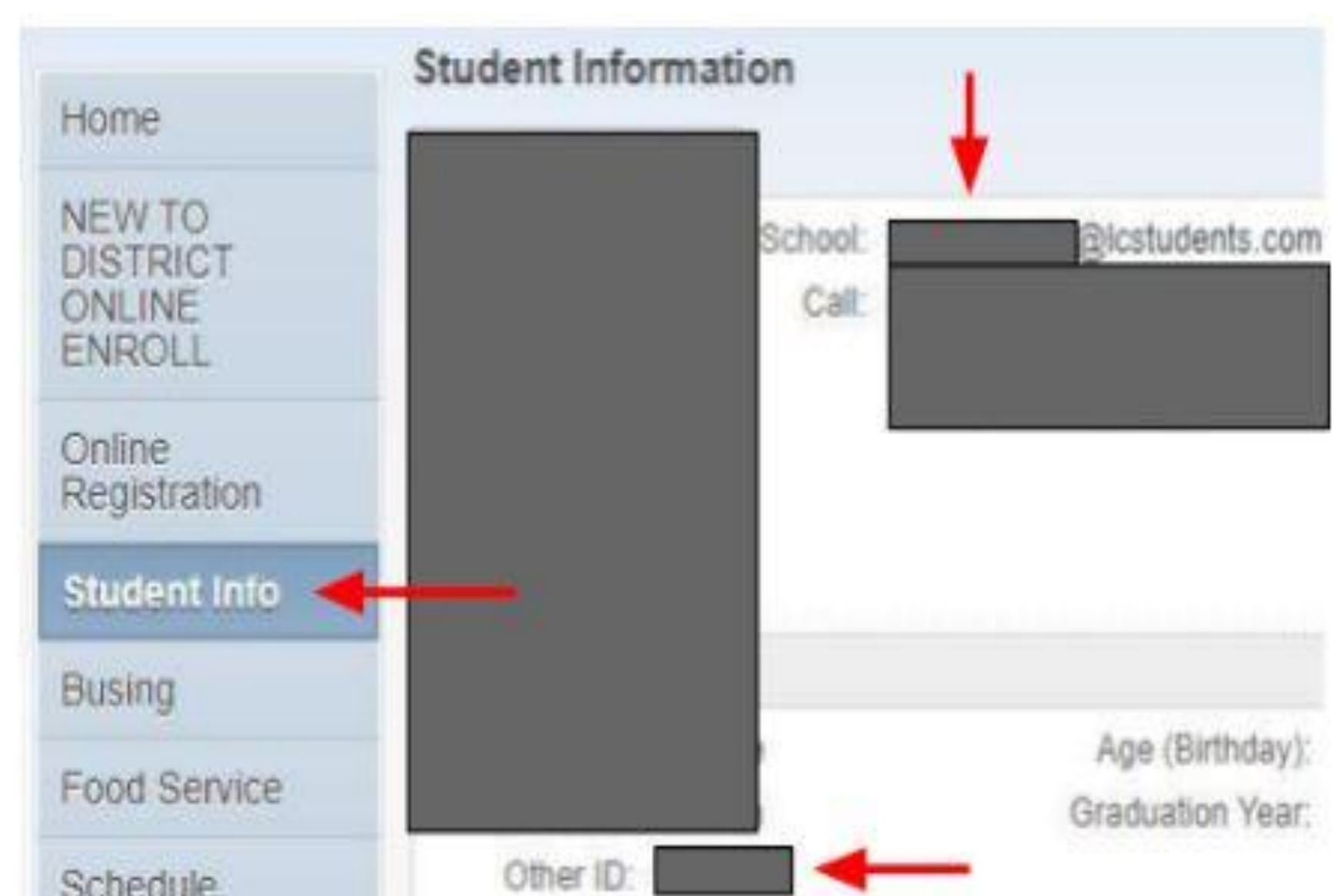
Student Login Information

The username and password for Canvas, Clever, student Gmail, and to log into a Lake Central chromebook are all the same. The formula is as follows:

- **Username:** First initial; middle initial; then last name followed by @lcstudents.com. (Some students may have a number after the last name if there are other students with similar initials)
- **Password:** Capitalized first initial of the first name; capitalized first initial of last name; followed by student ID number (NO SPACES)
- **Example:**
 - Username: Robert Lawrence Stine - rlstine@lcstudents.com
 - Password: RS1234567

You can also find your child's student gmail and student ID number in Skyward Family Access on the Student Info tab.

It should be right by their student picture and end with @lcstudents.com. Their student ID number is listed as Other ID under their picture.



Canvas

Canvas is where teachers will post assignments and other important information. The website is: <https://lakecentral.instructure.com/>. (You must use the Lake Central website for Canvas. Please do not just Google "Canvas" and use the generic website.) To access all of their courses in Canvas, click on the courses button on the blue menu along the left side. You can either click on an individual course from the list that shows up or All Courses if you wish to see them all.

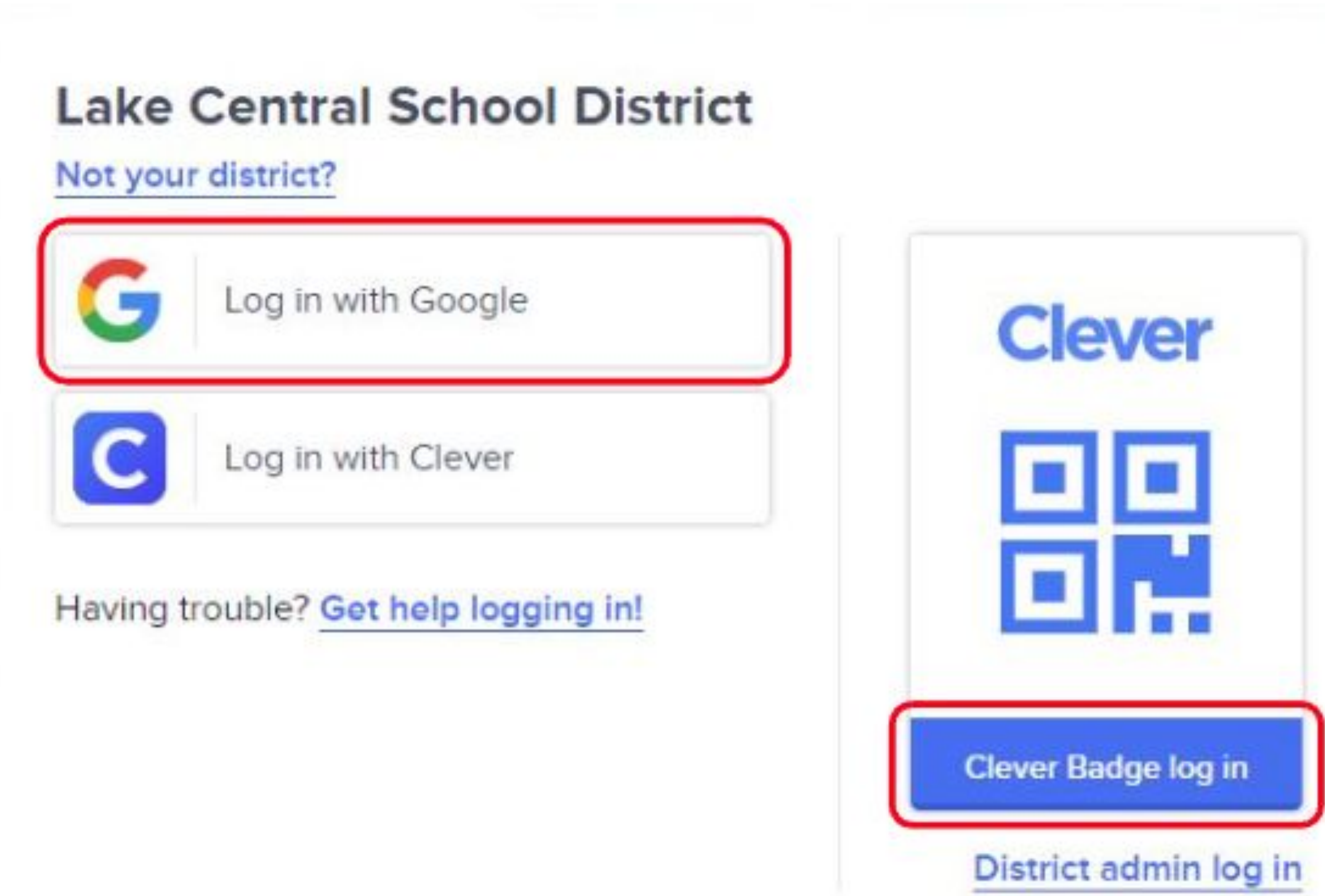

Online Textbooks & Programs: Clever

Almost all online textbooks and programs your child may need can be found on Clever. Clever can be accessed via Canvas using the Textbook Login button (see image above), or you can go to the website: <https://clever.com/in/lake-central>. The username and password for Clever are the same ones that you used for Canvas. Be sure to click either Log in with Google button. Our Kindergarten students may also have a Clever badge that was sent home by their teacher that they can scan to login with. In that case, you would click the Clever Badge login button instead.
