Happy March! I hope this newsletter finds you well and recovering from the change in the weather. Northwest Indiana... always be prepared for the unexpected.

What a month for the students, clubs, sporting events, and festivities. Our Science Olympiad team is heading to the state competition while students are on spring break. Our Poms/Dance team competed at the state competition on March 3rd bringing home 2nd place. The Jazz Band scored a Gold rating at their competition on March 2. Let's not forget, choir and band performed exceptionally well at their spring concerts in preparation for their ISSMA contest, Penny Wars raised over \$3000 for high school scholarships, and Paws for a Cause collected a large amount of needed provisions for the shelters. THANKS to all who either volunteered or donated to the above causes. Super job!

Spring break will take place from March 23-April 1. We will resume class on Tuesday, April 2. If you are traveling, please be careful and enjoy your break.

Thanks to those parents who drop off their child daily in the back lot. Please remember that once you are by the "**Drop Off Zone**" sign, that you release your children at that point. Please look for either Officer Nick Stamate or Mr. Graber to have you release your child(ren). Our goal is to keep the line moving so that the students are not late for class. As a reminder, the first hour begins at 8:47 and the students should be in their assigned class at that time. If not, they will receive a tardy slip to their first hour class. Thanks for your help in advance.

Parents, as a reminder, please let us know if there is an issue or concern with your son and/or daughter. Over the past few weeks, we have had parents indicate that their child was experiencing issues at school BUT did not tell anyone and the problem continued. Please let the administration or a counselor know if your child is having any issues. Waiting for a couple months for the problem to go away usually results in the matter becoming worse. The administrative staff appreciates knowing the issues so that we can resolve whatever might be going on with your child and/or friends or other students at school.

As the 3rd nine weeks ends on March 13, the teachers, counselors and administration will begin to make recommendations students that need to go to summer school. Summer school will be held at CMS starting the first week of June and continuing for 11 days. Unfortunately, there will not be bus service this year. Students attending summer school will need to attend for both ELA/math sessions.

ILEARN state mandated testing will begin on Tuesday, April 16-May 10. I will be sending out the schedule to all parents so that you can plan on having your child at school daily. All students will need to take a practice test in each subject area prior to the administration of the ILEARN tests. The practice test requirements are as follows:

5th—ELA, math, and social studies

6th---ELA, math, and science

7/8th—ELA and math

Students and staff will NOT be allowed to have a smart watch or cell phone on their person during the

testing time frame so please make sure to remind your child(ren). Students that are found to be in possession will receive a consequence of a Friday school due to the violation committed. The only exception granted by the state is for those students and staff that are diabetic who use their phone to track their blood sugars. The names of the students and their device type have already been submitted to Central Office and provided to the state as required. If possible, please make sure that your son/daughter is in attendance daily so that make up testing does not have to take place. On most days, we are completely finished testing by noon...again, please see the ILEARN testing schedule. Parents that are dropping your child off in the car line, plan ahead so that your child is here prior to the start of the testing times each day.

As the master schedule is in progress, those students that have been or decide to take a full year course (band or choir), the expectation is that the student remains in the course for the entire year. Parents...please make sure to touch base with your child and make sure they understand the commitment to that course. It's not easy to change the schedules after the year begins due to the blocking of certain classes. Thanks in advance for your help.

8th Grade Naviance Career Clusters Lesson

The counselors will be going into the Digital Citizenship classes in March to provide a career lesson through Naviance. The lesson uses a student's interests to explore career areas that make sense based on personality. The students will also be looking at careers based on the 16 career clusters. After the Naviance lesson, the Digital Citizenship classes have a career project that will be completed using some of the information from the Naviance activity.

High School Scheduling

The counselors have been working with all of the 8th graders the past few weeks getting their schedules ready for their Freshman year at Lake Central High School. A presentation about high school diplomas, graduation requirements, scheduling, and so on, was given to 8th grade students on February 9th. All students were given paperwork to complete for Freshman year schedules and were also given some informational papers about high school. Both middle school and high school counselors went into 8th grade classrooms on February 14th to help input their elective class choices into Skyward. The middle school counselors are able to make changes to these Freshman year elective choices on Skyward until March 20th. If any changes need to be made, please have your 8th grade child contact their counselor.

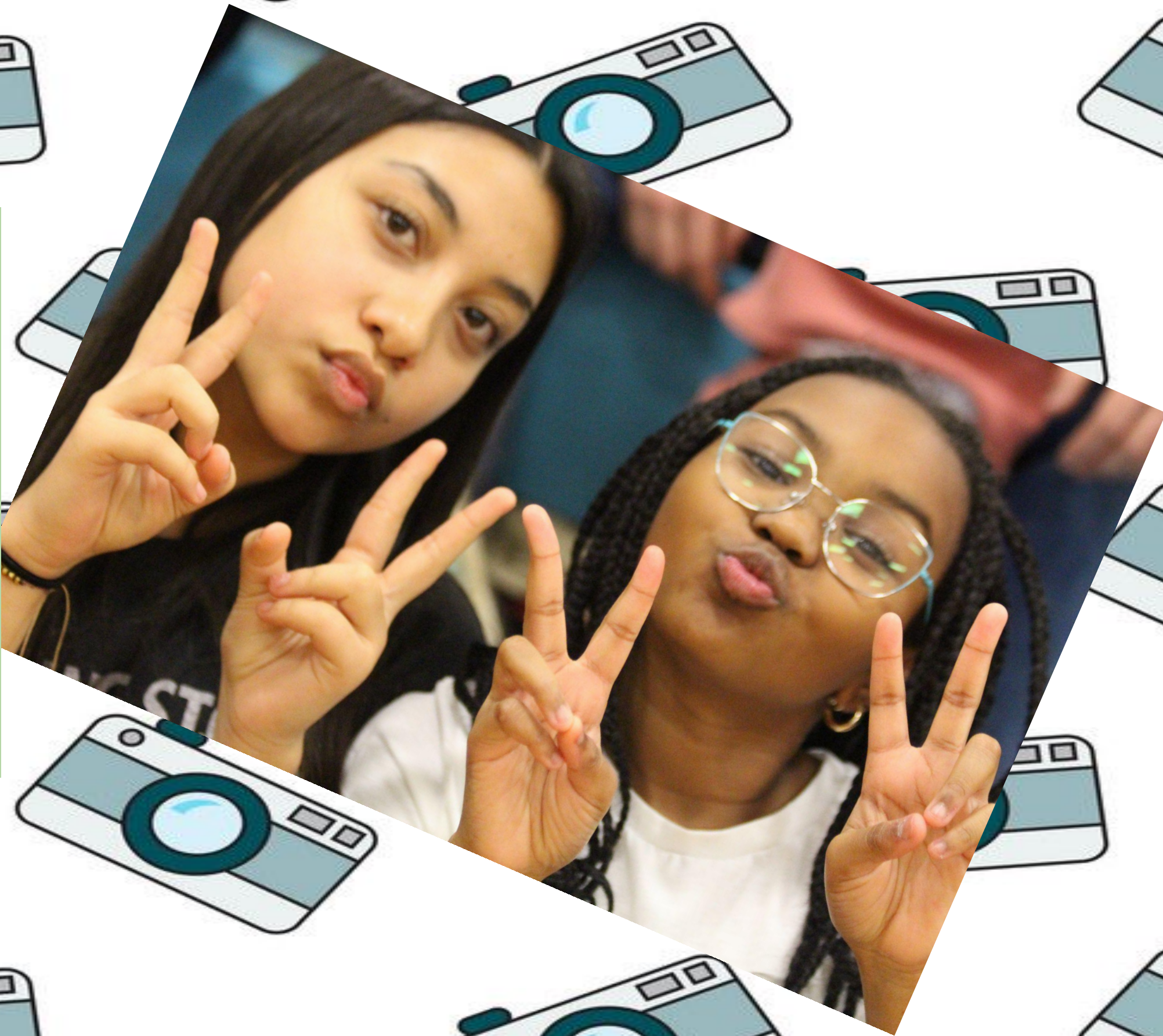

MATH COUNTS

Clark's Math Counts team recently travelled to Valpo University for some amazing competition.

A Math Counts Competition consists of 4 rounds followed by an awards presentation. Students start with the Sprint Round and have 40 minutes to complete 30 math problems without a calculator. In the second round, the Target Round, the focus is on problem-solving and mathematical reasoning

where students receive 4 pairs of problems and have 6 minutes to complete each pair and are allowed the use of a calculator. The third round is the Team Round which focuses on problem-solving and collaboration. The fourth and final round of the competition is the Oral Round where the top 8 individual scorers in the competition compete head-head in a best-of-three question competition with a buzzer until only one student remains. A big congratulations goes out to all the students who participated, and to Garrett Burwell who was the high scorer for Clark. We are so proud!

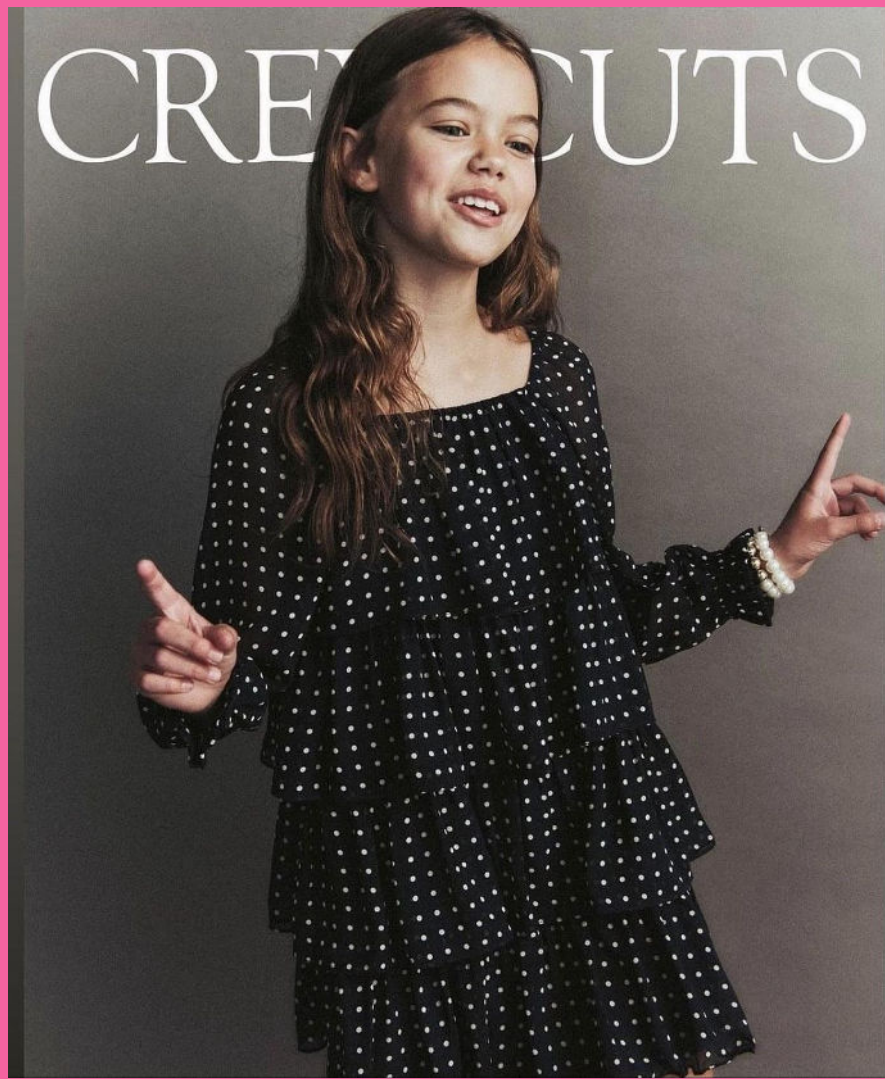
