



Happy October! I hope this newsletter finds you doing well. It's hard to believe how fast the school year is progressing. As we continue throughout the year, please be aware of the following dates:

Many of the club and groups have begun meeting for this year. If your child is looking for something to do, I strongly encourage them to get involved. Please check the daily announcements for meeting dates and times and get involved this month. After this month, it's very hard to join the clubs and groups.

Tutoring is underway. Parents, this is a free service that is available Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 8:00 until 8:30 a.m. All teachers are available for extra help. Students should come to tutoring if they have questions on a lesson or subject that they might not understand. In addition, students can attend academic assistance on Monday, Wednesday, or Friday during Advisory. Students need to ask their teacher for permission to go for academic assistance.

Communication is a critical component of middle school life. Please be mindful of what your child is doing in school. If you are seeing concerns with your child, please take the initiative to reach out to your child's teacher, counselor, and then, an administrator. The teacher should be the first point of contact since they are able to explain what is happening within the classroom. Additionally, please communicate with your child in regard to making inappropriate comments. Any comment that is made by your child in a "threatening" manner is taken seriously and charges could be filed with the local police department as well as consequences from the school.

Early morning drop offs are starting to be a concern for the administration. The doors are unlocked at 8:00 am on Tuesday and Thursday mornings for tutoring. If students are not going to tutoring, they should enter the building at 8:15. On Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, the doors open at 8:15. at 6:50-7:20 a.m. is not appropriate. In these situations, the students must remain in the locked door area until the assigned teacher arrives. The school does not provide supervision during that time frame. As a reminder, all students have transportation service that will bring your child to school and take them home in the afternoon.

Several students are being marked tardy due to their late arrival to school. As mentioned, students are expected to be in their first hour class by 8:47 a.m. Students who arrive at school after the 8:47 a.m. bell must report to the office for a late pass. Students can be assigned a detention or Friday school for being tardy.

Have you checked Skyward recently and updated emergency information? If not, please take a moment to do so as soon as possible. If your child needs to be picked up from school, and the person that you are sending to get your child is not on the emergency or family list, the main office staff will not be able to release your child to that individual. Also, if they are on the list, the main office secretaries might ask you to provide necessary documentation if they do not recognize the individual. Thank you for your help in advance.

College Go Week!


