The CMS staff have been busy looking at data from the testing that has occurred during the first nine weeks of school. From the ILEARN checkpoint #1 to the CFA's (Common Formative Assessments), the staff have been disaggregating data with the staff from Grimmer and Kahler. These meetings have been conducted by Mrs. Scheuneman, Director of Secondary Education. The purpose of these meetings has been to look at the CFA data and prepare the students for the upcoming ILEARN tests in the spring. Lots of positive teaching strategies and techniques have been shared amongst the subjects and grade levels.

Communication is critical. Parents, please make sure that you are talking to your child about appropriate language and conversations in school. Over the past few weeks, the administrative team and Officer Stamate (SRO) have visited every advisory class and talked about appropriate comments regarding school violence. If there is evidence that a student is making comments (whether joking or not), they will be suspended from school and a request for expulsion could be made. In addition,

Officer Stamate indicated that the SJPD and the local prosecuting attorney are willing to charge students for such acts, which include intimidation, a Level 5 Felony. Any form of school violence is unacceptable and will not be tolerated. The administration's goal is to provide your child with a safe environment, free from unnecessary distractions.

The winter sports are currently underway... please check the school calendar and stop by to cheer on our wrestling and the boys' basketball teams. Games will officially start within the next few weeks. Congratulations to our fall sports teams: cross country, football, cheer and dance teams. They had a great season! Good luck to our cheerleaders as they head to the state competition this month. Go Coyotes!

Hello Clark Coyote parents and family! I hope you all had a nice break and Halloween. Now that we are all coming off our halloween sugar rush, here are some reminders for traffic here at Clark.

During arrival, please use the car rider line for the safest option for your kiddos. If you choose to use the lot, please enter the very back section and park safely. Remind your kiddos to use the crosswalks only when coming into the school. Parents and guardians, please be very careful driving into and out of the Clark parking lot. Please obey the crosswalk signs and be mindful of the amount of kiddos and staff members walking in the parking lot. If there are any complaints, please let me know. We do have cameras in our lots and can address incidents if need be.

During dismissal, please use the car rider line for the safest option. If you are picking up in the parking lot, please park in a parking space and wait for your kiddos. Do not wait in the lanes and block traffic flow, especially by the crosswalks as this is very unsafe. Also please make sure not to use the handicap parking spaces unless you have a handicap plate or permission from the school related to a possible student with an injury from sports etc..

If your student is a walker, please remind them not to cut through residents' yards. We have had a few complaints this year of students doing this as a shortcut.

Sometime in the near future the Lake Central SRO team will be providing students on vape awareness and social media/gaming safety tips. If anyone has questions regarding the new vaping trends and or social media/gaming trends, feel free to reach out to me anytime. 


