Happy April! As we enter the final stretch of the school year, I want to ask you to continue to encourage your child (ren) to do their best over the next few weeks. There are several items going on where we need your child to be in attendance daily, focus while at school, complete their daily assignments, and ask for help if needed.

Parents...need your ATTENTION... during the month of March, CMS experienced many issues with cell phone activity that impacted the building. Please understand that if your child is involved in inappropriate cell phone activity after school hours and later becomes a disruption to the educational process, your child could be suspended, police notified, and/or additional consequences could take place. I ask you to monitor what APPS your child is viewing, sharing with other students, etc. Many recent issues have involved students obtaining fake phone numbers, calling classmates but with a different name, creating some harassment situations, as well as visiting sites that are not appropriate for minors. So, please be diligent and continue to monitor what your child is doing on the cell phones.

April begins the state mandated ILEARN tests. The schedule for testing is below. All students need to be in their classroom and ready for the tests which will start immediately after the morning Pledge of Allegiance. Additionally, per state guidelines, all cell phones and smart watches are not allowed in the testing areas. The only exception is for students that have a medical reason, i.e. diabetics who monitor their blood sugar, and this information must be submitted to the IDOE. Students that arrive late to school will remain in the main office until the testing session is over. Once the session is over, those students that arrived late will report to the LGI and begin make up testing. So, please have your child in attendance and on time so that make-up testing is not needed. As I reviewed your child's data on recent ILEARN checkpoint tests, many of the students are only a few points away from reaching the next level: Approaching Proficiency, At Proficiency, or Above Proficiency. Our goal is for all of our CMS students to be in the above proficiency category. A couple more correct responses will provide the scores we are striving for with ILEARN.

# Library News




