





In Social Studies the incredible team of Ben Szafasz, Jack Szafasz, and Roberto Rodriguez got a near perfect score. They had 24/25 questions correct in their division. This score earned them 1st place in the area competition and 2nd place at the state level! Congratulations to all team members! Everyone did an outstanding job this year!

Mrs. Hart's 5th grade advanced social studies class visited the Indianapolis Statehouse on May 2nd. They took part in the "We the People" congressional mock hearings sponsored by the Indiana Bar Association. Over the past few months, the students have worked hard writing and practicing their speeches, and preparing for the follow-up questions they could be asked. Each student presented their speech to a panel of judges, answering questions about the Constitution, and showcasing their understanding of the American government. Mrs. Hart's class brought home the second place medal, and was given a rating of "Outstanding".





Mrs. Guzman's 8th graders searched the school for some high touch surfaces and WOW, did they find some good samples. While learning about germ transfer, bacteria growth, and mold growth, students swabbed high traffic touched surfaces. Students then transferred their swabs to a petri dish and into an incubator. The growth was almost immediately noticeable! Within days, samples had grown with some taking over the entire petri dish! Things like door handles, keyboards, smartboards, and personal belongings like cellphones were all showing signs of bacterial growth. Lesson learned - always wash your hands!
